

Kellyquilter's Skillbuilder Series: French Double-Fold Binding Entirely by Machine

From the front, no one can tell this isn't a hand-finished French Double-Fold binding!

SUPPLIES

-Sewing machine: PROVIDED!

-“Quilt”: No flannels, please!

One quilted square (top, batting, backing) 14 - 18” square. This can be a square cut from pre-quilted fabric, a single “whole cloth” quilt that you have hand or machine quilted, a small quilt made from “orphan blocks” (like mine, made from 4 leftover blocks), etc. It needn't be anything fancy; simply a quilted square that you can machine bind in class.

-Binding fabric: ¼ yard (we'll cut strips in class)

-Rotary cutter, mat, and 24” long rotary cutting ruler (6-9” wide)

-THREAD: 50 wt or 60 wt cotton thread to match / blend with the top of the “quilt”

-Small (3½” - 6½”) square rotary ruler with the 45-degree line marked on the ruler

-Roxanne's Glue Baste-It in the EZ-Squeezy bottle OR Roxanne's Glue Baste-It in the 2 oz bottle with the long “needle-like” tip.

-Mechanical marking pencil

(“lead” pencil if binding fabric is light; chalk if binding fabric is dark)

-Seam ripper, thread snips, pins, and any other favorite notions
