SUPPLY LIST & PRE-WORKSHOP PREP



The Starry Irish Chain quilt is a contemporary version of a traditional favorite. Kelly has combined a variable-sized Irish Chain with her Echo Star block, a block quickly and easily constructed without "y-seams".

The quilt can be made in two sizes. Or, if you simply wish to learn the block construction technique, fabric requirements are included for a single-block option to make the Echo Star.

SUPPLIES:

SEWING MACHINE: PROVIDED!

THREAD: 50 wt or 60 wt machine-piecing thread,

neutral color

KELLYQUILTER ACRYLIC TEMPLATE PROJECT SET: Templates H4, ET4, LQ4 AND HET8 are required for each participant. The cost of the template kit, which also includes anti-skid material, is \$28 (tax included; retail value \$34 before tax), payable to Kelly at the beginning of the workshop (cash or credit / debit card, please).

ROTARY CUTTER for in-class cutting: 28mm preferred

CUTTING MAT: There will be cutting stations in the classroom, HOWEVER if you have a mat (12" square or so) on a rotating base, please feel free to bring it. A rotating mat is very helpful when cutting around acrylic templates.

RULERS: Your favorite ruler for cutting width-of-fabric strips (typically 6"-8.5" x 18"-24.5").

You'll use this ruler for pre-workshop cutting AND please bring to class.

-a square ruler at least 6" square.

NOTIONS: Seam ripper (just in case), thread snips, pins, any other favorite notions


MAGIC Premium Quilting & Crafting Spray (my personal favorite) or Mary Ellen's Best Press (for pre-workshop fabric preparation - see next page)


FABRIC: See table on page 2

WOF = width of fabric

FQ = fat quarter (approx. 18" x 22"

Star - Main Color	One FQ or one quarter-yard cut	For two pairs of two identical blocks: ½ yard each of two different fabrics	For two pairs of six identical blocks: 1½ yards each of two different fabrics
Star - Accent Color	1/8 yard	For two pairs of two identical blocks: 1/4 yard each of two different fabrics	For two pairs of six identical blocks: 3/4 yard each of two different fabrics
Chain	N/A	½ yard**	1 yard**
Backing	One FQ	3 yards	5 yards* *(This amount provides minimal overage on two opposite sides.)
Batting	A piece at least 20" square	Throw size	Queen
Binding (based on 2½" wide strips)	1/4 yard	½ yard	³¼ yard

^{**}If you wish to add a pieced border to the small quilt (extending the chain around the perimeter as I've done in the sample pictured on page 1), you'll need a total of 3 yards of negative space fabric for the small quilt OR a total of $6\frac{1}{4}$ yards of negative space fabric for the large quilt. The amount of chain fabric listed above is adequte to accommodate the border addition for the small quilt; purchase a total of $1\frac{1}{8}$ yards chain fabric for the large quilt. By adding the pieced outer border, the finished size of the small quilt is 52" square; the finished size of the large quilt is 84" square. IF YOU ADD THE PIECED BORDER, BE SURE TO ADJUST THE AMOUNTS OF BACKING AND BINDING FABRIC ACCORDINGLY!

Pre-Workshop Fabric Preparation and Pre-cutting: Please complete these steps before class.

STEP 1: Fabric Preparation

Prepare all of your quilt top fabrics by generously (quite damp; not dripping wet) spritzing them with Magic Premium Quilting / Crafting Spray (or Mary Ellen's Best Press) to add body and mild stiffness to the fabric, then press the fabric until dry with a dry iron on cotton setting. Or, if you prefer, you can spritz the fabrics, iron them briefly, then hang them until completely dry. Once dry, press out the wrinkles using a steam iron on cotton setting.

STEP 2: Cutting Prior to Class

If making only one Echo Star block,

Star Main Color Fabric - Fat Quarter:

Cut one strip, 8" X 22"; Cut one strip, 4" x 22"

Bring both cut strips and the remainder of the FQ to class.

OR

Star Main Color Fabric - Quarter-yard Cut:

Cut one strip, $8" \times WOF$ (width of fabric). Bring the 8" strip to class.

Star Accent Color Fabric:

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Cut one strip, 4" x WOF

Bring the 4" strip to class.

Negative Space / Background Fabric - Fat Quarter (approx. 18" x 22"), cut:

- -Two rectangles, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22"; trim each to $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ "
- -One rectangle, $8" \times 22"$
- -One rectangle, 4" x 22"

If making the small, or large quilt, for the Echo Star block:

Star Main Color Fabric - FQs:

From each of two Fat Quarters,

Cut one strip, 8" X 22";

Cut one strip, $4" \times 22"$

Bring all the cut strips and the remainder of the FQs to class.

OR

OR

Star Main Color Fabric - Quarter-yard Cuts:

From each of two Quarter-yard Cuts,

Cut one strip, $8" \times WOF$ (width of fabric). Bring the 8" strips to class.

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Star Accent Color Fabric: From each of two Eighth-yard cuts,

Cut one strip, 4" x WOF

Bring the 4" strips to class.

Negative Space / Background Fabric:

Square-up the cut edge of the negative-space fabric, then cut one $8" \times WOF$ strip and one $1\frac{1}{2}" \times WOF$ strip.

-Fold the 8" strip with selvages together (like it came off the bolt). Cut the 8" x WOF strip in half yielding two rectangles each measuring approximately 8" x 22".

-Leave one rectangle as an 8" x 22" piece.

-From the second rectangle, cut two strips, $4'' \times 22''$.

Bring all the cut strips and rectangles to class.

NOTE: In our 3-hour class, we will be focusing primarily on the construction of the Echo Star block. If you plan to make either the Small or Large Quilt, please bring your CHAIN fabric and remaining BACKGROUND fabric to class, also. Kelly will talk through the Chain Block construction by demonstrating with block step-outs. Your workshop handout will also have instructions for the Variable Irish Chain block construction. As time permits, you may cut and piece a second Echo Star block or begin cutting for the Variable Irish Chain blocks.
