Finishing a Quilt with Facing (Instead of Binding) Kelly Ashton, Kellyquilter Designs

SUPPLY LIST and PRE-WORKSHOP PREP





SUPPLIES -SEWING MACHINE: PROVIDED!

-"QUILT": (1) *quilted* square or rectangle (top, batting** and backing) no less than 14" on any side and no more than 16½" on any side. This can be a square or rectangle cut from pre-quilted fabric, a single "whole cloth" quilt that is hand- or machine-quilted, a small quilt made from an "orphan" block or blocks", etc. It needn't be anything fancy - simply a quilted square or rectangle to which a facing will be applied in class. NO FLANNEL FOR THE TOP, BACK, OR FACING FABRIC, PLEASE

TWO NOTES: For this first quilt-facing experience, I recommend 1) **using a 100% cotton, low-loft batting such as Quilter's Dream Select, and 2) having a "quilt" that .does not have patchwork points that end ¼" away from the edge of the quilt (see my example in the photo: my star points are away from the edge of the quilt).

- **-FACING FABRIC:** ¹/₃ yard (we'll cut facing pieces in class). If possible, I suggest using the same fabric for facing that is the predominant fabric around the edge of the quilt (example: I used the light background fabric of my quilt top as the facing fabric).
- -ROTARY CUTTER and RULER (6-9" wide X 24" long) cutting mats are available in the classroom; you are welcome to bring your own, if you wish.
- **-THREAD:** 50 wt or 60 wt cotton thread, neutral color OR a color to match the facing fabric to apply facing to the quilt; thread, 50 wt or 60 wt in color to match the facing fabric to stitch down the edges of the facing

-HAND-STITCHING NEEDLES: (PROVIDED by Kelly) -SCISSORS: small and sharp (such as straight-blade embroidery scissors) -POINT TURNER: available in class if you don't have one

-ROXANNE'S GLUE BASTE-IT: the EZ-Squeezy bottle OR the 2 oz bottle with the long "needle-like" tip.

-NOTIONS: Seam ripper, thread snips, pins, any other favorite notions

-MAGIC Premium Quilting & Crafting Spray (my favorite) or Mary Ellen's Best

Press: for pre-workshop fabric prep (see below)

Pre-Workshop Fabric Preparation: Please complete this step *before* class.

Prepare your facing fabric by generously (quite damp; not dripping wet) spritzing it with Magic Premium Quilting / Crafting Spray (or Mary Ellen's Best Press) to add body and mild stiffness to the fabric, then press the fabric until dry with a dry iron on cotton setting. Or, if you prefer, you can spritz the fabric, iron it briefly, then hang it until completely dry. Once dry, press out the wrinkles using a steam iron on cotton setting.
